# Using Our Philanthropic Power to

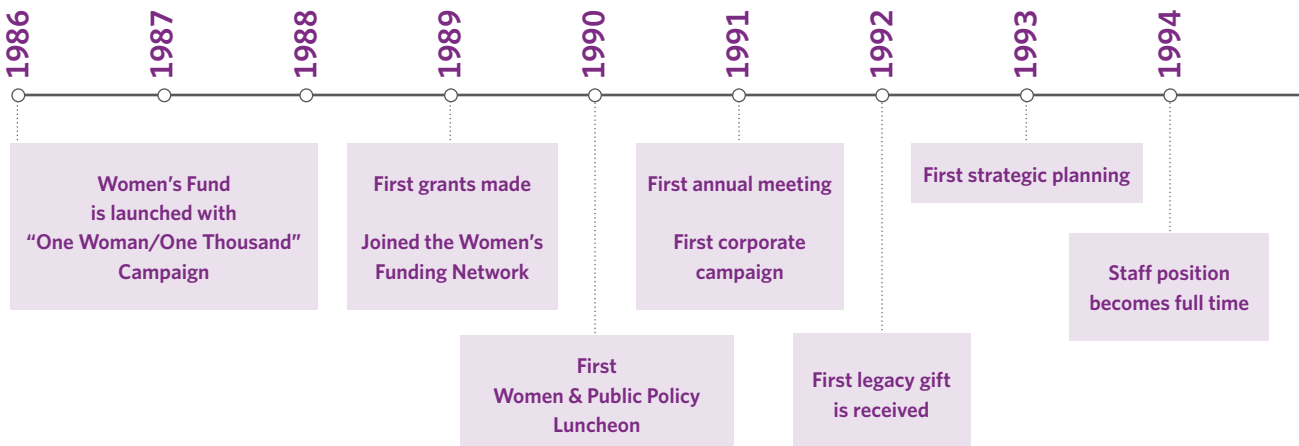


In the early '80s a global movement began to emerge. Born out of the increasing economic strength of women and paired with growing awareness of gender inequality, this movement called on women to use their growing philanthropic power to directly address the issues that affect them. By investing in one another, we could change the future — not only for women, but for all.

And so it was that in 1986 the Women's Fund of Greater Milwaukee opened its doors, becoming an integral part of the Women's Funding Network.

"The idea that women could use their own philanthropic strength to affect change was powerful," said Judy Murphy, a founding mother of the Women's Fund. "Seeing the issues of inequality for women and girls in our own community, we knew that we needed to be part of that movement, and bring its powerful message to Milwaukee."

Now, 25 years later, the Women’s Fund bears the title of oldest and largest public foundation in the state of Wisconsin dedicated to programs that support women and girls. We’ve made great strides in Milwaukee through our support of women-led initiatives, and our grants have increased more than 30-fold in our 25 years of operation.

And yet in many ways our work has just begun.

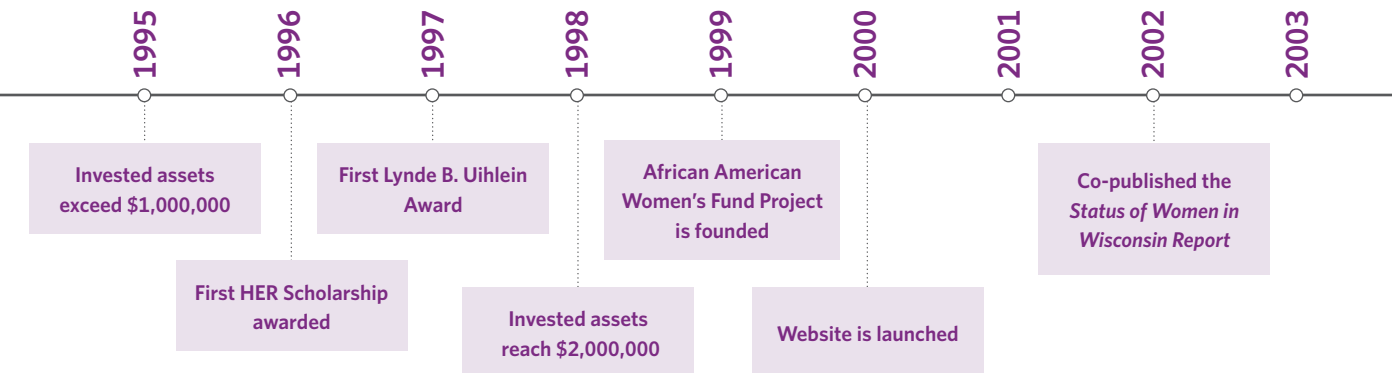

But as we have done for the past quarter-century, we will continue to support the work being done in our community to create a world that is just and fair for women and girls. Because we know what you know:

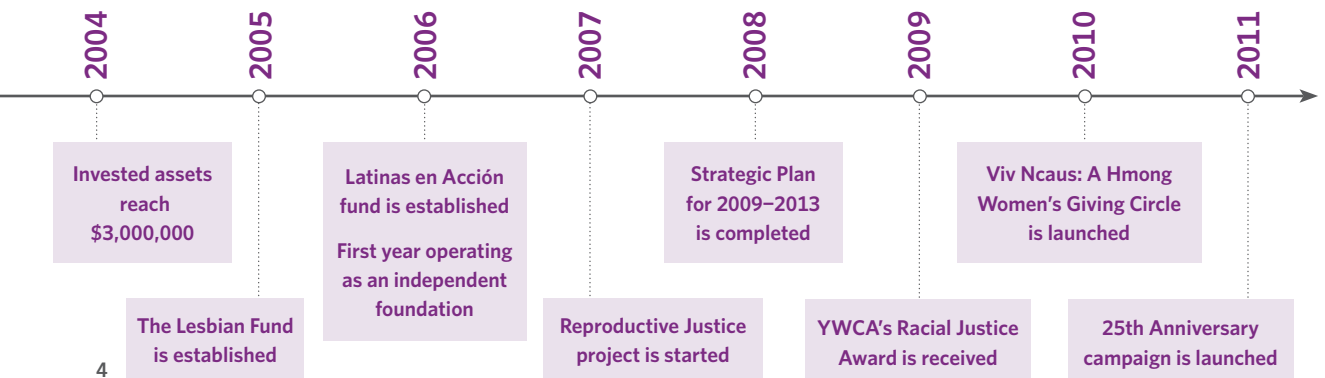

# Say 'Social Change?'

## Changing the Future vs. Changing the Present

We know the work of social service organizations in our community is critical to meeting the *immediate needs* of women and girls. But we also know that for *long-lasting change*, we must alter the environments in which we live. That's why we focus our efforts on working toward social change — getting to the root cause of social issues — as the best path to a more just world for women and girls. We think of our work as changing the future.

To that end, we invest in women-led initiatives and solutions through two primary channels:

- Our **Grantmaking Programs**, which provide the financial backing for social change initiatives, and
- Our **Capacity Building Programs**, which provide leadership and training for those working toward social change.

We believe that by focusing our efforts in four main areas — Economic Justice, Social Justice, Leadership Development, and Education — we can have the greatest impact on lasting change.

And if we're successful, the future will look something like this:

- women will earn a dollar for every dollar earned by a man;
- women and their children will live in healthy and prosperous communities;
- women will be fairly represented in the top rungs of leadership in both the public and private sectors; and
- women will have equal opportunities and access to high-quality education at all levels.

# Grantmaking: Viv Ncaus: A Hmong Women's Giving Circle Coming Together as Sisters

In December of 2010, we welcomed Viv Ncaus: A Hmong Women's Giving Circle, as the newest member of our philanthropy family. The first Hmong women's giving circle in Wisconsin, Viv Ncaus' vision is to build a culture where Hmong women and girls have the right to equality, safety, opportunity, and self-determination.

Though groups of Hmong women have worked on their own for decades to end violence against women and to assist new refugees in settling into their new lives, they recognized that more could be accomplished by working together with the Women's Fund.

"We're excited about Viv Ncaus because we share a goal of engaging women in philanthropy for changes they want to see in the world," said Elaine Maly, Executive Director. "We believe that women don't have to be the object of charity, they can drive change by investing in their communities."

With a first-year goal of raising \$10,000, the founders of Viv Ncaus believe the fund will quickly demonstrate that Hmong women can support their own innovative community-based efforts and organizations run by and for Hmong women and girls.

According to co-founder Nor Yang, the words *viv ncaus* imply "sisters" in Hmong. The founders added this to the name of their fund to symbolize it is "a sisterhood funded by sisters."

We couldn't have said it better.

# Capacity Building: The Black Infant Mortality Project

## Heartbreaking Statistics Demand Action

The infant mortality rates among African Americans in Milwaukee are startling. In fact, Milwaukee's rate of black infant mortality has risen higher than the rate in 56 other countries, including Jamaica, Ukraine, Costa Rica, Ecuador and Malaysia.

Infant mortality is a global indicator of any community's well being. It's not just about women or infants, it's a sign of how well we are *all* doing. At the intersection of racial justice and gender oppression, the disparity in birth outcomes clearly represents a reproductive justice issue.

We are part of a new coalition— the Milwaukee Lifecourse Initiative for Healthy Families (LIHF) — that will be working together to decrease the disparities in birth outcomes. The goals of the coalition are to:

- improve health care for African American women,
- address social and economic inequities, and
- strengthen African American families and communities.

According to Elaine Maly, our Executive Director, "Infant mortality is impacted by poverty, but educated middle and upper income African American women are experiencing poor birth outcomes, too. This is far more than an access to health care issue." The more equity women — *all* women — experience, the more prosperous the community.

Bottom line: women are a good investment.

# Our Grantmaking Programs

## Providing the financial support for social change.

### **Social Change Grantmaking**

Emphasizing leadership and economic and social justice, this program provides critical financial support to organizations working to create social change through women and girls.

### **Cultures of Giving Funds**

The **African American Women's Fund Project** is dedicated to funding programs that support the health, well-being, and advancement of African American women and girls.

**Viv Ncaus: A Hmong Women's Giving Circle** This sisterhood of women raises funds to build a culture where Hmong women and girls have the right to equality, safety, opportunity and self-determination.

**Latinas en Acción** seeks to provide a legacy of leadership, excellence, respect, health and education for Latinas in greater Milwaukee.

**The Lesbian Fund** supports initiatives that increase the visibility of lesbians as community leaders, advocate for lesbian concerns, and benefit lesbians in all stages of their lives.

### **Reproductive Justice Project**

The Reproductive Justice Project, inspired by a matching grant opportunity from the *Groundswell Fund at the Tides Foundation*, supports women of color led strategies that address the right to have and parent children, access to quality reproductive health care and information, and the ability to live and work in an environment that is safe and healthy.

### **Her Scholarship**

For low-income women over 35 who are returning to school, the Her Scholarship was created by donors who believe that education is critical to economic independence and financial security for women and their families.

### **Girls Leading Change**

This latest addition to the Women's Fund, Girls Leading Change is a program to engage teen girls in philanthropy in partnership with *Lead2Change*, a resource for youth-led community service projects.

# Our Capacity Building Programs

**Leadership and training for those working toward social change.**

## **Infant Mortality Project**

The Planning Council for Health and Human Services, Inc. and the Women's Fund of Greater Milwaukee are facilitating an action planning process for the *Milwaukee Lifecourse Initiative for Healthy Families* (LIHF) project coalition. The group, including more than 60 local organizations, has received funding by The Oversight and Advisory Committee of the UW School of Medicine and Public Health. The goals of the planning process are to: improve health care, strengthen African American families, address inequities, and develop a collaborative that will continue to focus on the issue beyond the planning process.

## **The White House Project**

We are a coordinating partner in Wisconsin for The White House Project, a national nonpartisan program that inspires and engages women in political leadership. Over the last four years, 300 women have attended White House Project programs in Milwaukee. Two-thirds of participants are women of color and over half are under the age of 35.

## **Social Change Exchange**

A forum for our grant partners and donors to come together to discuss social change issues impacting women in our community. In 2010, two well-attended forums were held — one on the impact of the census, and another to address Milwaukee's black infant mortality crisis.

## **The Women of Color Fundraising Network**

This peer support group for women of color working as fundraisers provides a safe space to discuss how race and class issues impede their success. Members share support and contacts while discussing issues relating to the local fundraising environment.

## **Raising Resources**

A one-day fundraising training program designed specifically for women to develop knowledge, capacity, and confidence for raising the resources needed to support the programs, projects and organizations we care about most.

The Women's Fund is proud to provide audited financial statements for 2010. Our operations generated an increase in net assets of \$144,000, which includes investment income of \$229,618.

Significant collections have been made on pledges receivable, as many donors have completed multi-year pledge commitments of \$10,000. As we move into our 25th year, we encourage all of our donors to consider new multi-year pledges to support the ongoing operations of the Women's Fund.

Our Board Designated Fund invested at the Greater Milwaukee Foundation has a balance of \$2,292,594 reflecting a significant continued

recovery from the economic downturn. Total invested assets at the Greater Milwaukee Foundation including donor designated funds and constituent funds like the African American Women's Fund Project, Latinas en Acción, and The Lesbian Fund total \$5,071,674. The gross return on investments was 13.5%.

We take our role as stewards of these resources very seriously and strive to maximize income available for program services.
